Washington Township and its residents, visitors and property owners face two types of natural hazards: Wildfires in the Pinelands and Storms with hazardous flooding and winds from both Coastal Nor'Easters/Hurricanes and intense Summer Thunderstorms.

Our Emergency Responders are prepared for when an incident has occurred, however it is important for the public to takes actions ahead-of-time to be prepared and also to respond properly for their personal safety and property protection
